Ecosystem and biodiversity loss are threatening the planet's ability to provide goods and services -deforestation for example, disrupts our weather patterns and the water cycle, contributes to climate change, and destroys the habitats of important species. Chemicals and waste are polluting the air, soil and water, killing millions each year.

We need to collaborate and create a blueprint for economic and societal future considering security of resources of environment in a globalized world. We live in an integrated ecosystem which does not give space to ignore local problems - pollution and pathogens are trans boundary issues.

A variety of market, policy and institutional failures mean that the Earth's natural capital tends to be used in ways that are economically inefficient and wasteful, without sufficient reckoning of the true social costs of resource depletion, and without adequate reinvestment in other forms of wealth. These failures threaten the long-run sustainability of growth and progress made on social welfare. We are yet to provide access to electricity, sanitation, safe and clean drinking water to a sizeable demography around the world.


