Global economic activity is picking up with a long-awaited cyclical recovery in investment, manufacturing, and trade. As per IMF, world growth is expected to rise from 3.1 percent in 2016 to 3.5 percent in 2017 and 3.6 percent in 2018. Stronger activity, expectations of more robust global demand, reduced deflationary pressures, and optimistic financial markets are all upside developments. But structural impediments to a stronger recovery and a balance of risks that remains tilted to the downside, especially over the medium term, remain important challenges.

Recent data corroborate early signals that the global economy started 2017 on a solid footing. Global GDP likely expanded 2.8% annually in Q1, matching Q4's result, according to the data available. The underlying economic story remains largely the same, with the emerging markets gradually recovering on the back of a pick-up in global demand and higher commodity prices, while advanced economies are generally benefiting from resilient domestic demand.

On the domestic front, monthly data suggest that the economy ended the fiscal year on a soft note in the final quarter, after growth surprised on the upside in Q3 FY 2016-17. Industrial production dropped in February and the manufacturing and services PMIs came in at low levels throughout the quarter.

However, the PMIs picked up in March, suggesting that economic activity is improving after demonetization-related cash shortages in earlier months. Meanwhile, the country's most significant tax reform in decades cleared more hoops at the start of April as key legislation related to the GST reform was approved in Parliament. Additional legislation still needs to be passed by the State Assemblies and specific tax rates set before the targeted 1 July rollout date.

The last couple of months witnessed some wide-ranging activities organised by the Chamber which would have long-term impacts on the socio-economic canvas of the State in particular and the Eastern part of the country in general. The eclectic bouquet of events and activities has been presented in the Newsletter.

In the coming months your Chamber will continue with its relentless efforts towards supporting the Government in its development initiatives and playing a meaningful role for industry and trade in the region. In this context and in the process, the Chamber would be offering an interesting and relevant range of events, programmes and projects.

The Bengal Chamber organized an Interactive Session with Mr Rami Goldratt on 7th March 2017 at The Chamber premises. Currently serving as the CEO of Goldratt Group, Mr Rami Goldratt, over the years, has been involved in consulting assignments with global companies spanning Retail, Healthcare, Automobiles, Chemicals, Textiles, etc.

His father, the late Dr. Eliyahu Goldratt shot into the global spotlight with "The Goal", a book that launched the Theory of Constraints (TOC) into the world. Rami Goldratt continues his father's work by helping companies improve their response time to the market using TOC as a systems management tool. India is the second biggest centre for Goldratt Consulting and he makes sure he keeps his finger on the pulse of the country, coming down once every few months. Mr. Goldratt was in Pune recently to conduct a session on breakthrough innovation using TOC at the Tata Management and Training Centre constantly designing solutions to the new challenges companies are facing and using TOC in a VUCA (volatile, uncertain, complex and ambiguous) world. In a business session with senior Chamber members, Mr Goldratt shared his experiences across various Industry verticals.

He took the consumer goods industry and uncertainty as the essential point of departure, and spoke of the need to forecast the sales of a certain product in a certain place at a certain time. Based on this, he said, the operations leaders would know how much to produce. One would expect that over time the ability to make an accurate forecast would improve with more information on recorded consumption and more sophisticated IT tools but reality shows that it is exactly the opposite — it is getting worse. More and more surpluses and shortages keep making the supply chains unwieldy. This is because there are three dynamics in consumer behaviour

that make it almost impossible to predict accurately. The first is that consumers are becoming more sensitive to get the products they want and this puts pressure on retailers to work with wider assortments; else they will lose sales. The wider the assortment, the harder it is to have a good forecast of what will sell because the company will stock more units and managing the depth of this inventory becomes difficult. The second is consumer tolerance. Consumers are willing to wait less and less for the product to become available which means that retailers need to have it in the stores and not in the warehouse. Finally, product life is becoming shorter with new products constantly being introduced and retailers needing to offer discounts to sell the older version. This puts a lot of pressure on brands. Unless the new launch is a star product like the iPhone, there will be a clash between old and new offerings. All this makes the ability to forecast and have the right inventory impossible. The only way for companies to survive is to reduce the reaction time to market since it's impossible to have an accurate forecast. One needs to capture signals from reality of what is selling and react to it as fast as possible. Companies that cannot dramatically improve response times will not exist in the future. Earlier having a fast response time was a luxury; now it's a necessity. TOC removes operational constraints that block the flow and improve response times, whether in marketing, operations or production.

The main constraint is often policy driven. What typically increases response times is working with bigger batches. In procurement if one waits longer before placing an order, response time would naturally increase. However, companies want to accumulate all orders to get a good deal. What they do not notice is that every such incident increases their response time. This one major constraint is hurting the flow.

So, how does one manage the constraints once they are identified? Mr. Goldratt further added that the major obstacle to flow causing project delays happens not in the execution, but the planning stage. When setting timelines, people will give an extended buffer – typically 50% — to be reliable. The problem is that people end up using this buffer period whether they need it or not, and are likely to overshoot it as issues crop up towards the end. A project is a chain of tasks and to ensure that it finishes on time, the project manager needs to make sure each task finishes on time. One has to take the individual 'safety' out of the equation and use it as part of the overall project buffer.

In engineering companies, the important thing is how to provide better value to clients by delivering the project on time. Due date performance in engineering companies is very poor and clients tolerate it because everybody is the same. One of the fundamental mistakes made in project management that causes major obstacles to flow is bad multi-tasking.

He ended with the following advice to the business leaders on how to do that - The company needs to start with analyzing the value and competitive edge they are aiming to give and what they want to deliver to which segments, and then analyze the major constraints that prevents from delivering more value.

WORKSHOP ON GST OUTREACH PROGRAMME

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry partnering with the Commissionerate of Central Excise, Kolkata I, organized a half-day Workshop on GST Outreach Programme on 8th March 2017 at KUSB Auditorium in Kendriya Utpad Shulk Bhawan. This was a part of the massive outreach programme on GST launched by the Central Board of Excise and Customs (CBEC) for educating taxpayers for smooth transition to GST, which was scheduled to be launched in the

next few months. Mr. P K Saha, Co-Chairperson, Indirect Taxes Committee, BCC&I & Partner - Tax & Regulatory Services, Price Waterhouse & Co. LLP, on behalf of BCC&I, deliberated on Practical Aspects in Implementation of GST. Other Speakers from CBEC made presentations on migration to GSTN and discussed various procedures and issues involved. The Workshop was attended by close to 120 delegates.

INTERACTION WITH JAPANESE CONSUL GENERAL

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized an Interactive Session with Mr. Masayuki Taga, Consul General of Japan in Kolkata during the Managing Committee Meeting, held on 9th March 2017 in The Bengal Chamber Premises.

Welcoming the Consul General of Japan, Mr Masayuki Taga, on his first visit to the Chamber, Mr. Sutanu Gosh, President, The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry introduced him to the members, present in the meeting.

Mr. Taga deliberated on the economic relationship between Japan and India. He said that in the last 7/8 years and especially in the last three years, Indo-Japandese relation has been deepening and widening. The Prime Ministers of the two countries have been having formal meetings on regular basis. From the regular mutual visits various joint efforts have materialized. The relationship between the Prime Minister of India and the Prime Minister of Japan has been good and various agreements have been signed on the economic side. The countries also have had bilateral dialogues, defence cooperations and a few agreements on bilateral issues. FDI from Japan to India had increased. Number of Japanese companies existing in India has increased. The Consul General felt that there existed a lot of opportunities to increase the share of Japanese companies in the Eastern part of the country. Many Japanese companies have moved to the West and Southern part of the country looking at the port and other infrastructure facilities. Mr. Taga would like to promote the economic relation between Japan and the Eastern part of India including West Bengal to bring Japanese businesses to this region. He noted that West Bengal had an advantage in so far as availability of power etc. However, it was a question of better business opportunities that are attracting Japanese Companies to Southern and the Western parts of India.

Mr. Taga felt that it was more of a question of connectivity from the South East to the East Asian countries that would give a boost to investment in the Eastern part of India. The terrain in the East and the North East is difficult posing a challenge to movement of bulk cargo for manufacturing industries. There exist opportunities for building good connectivity from the Eastern part of India through the Bay of Bengal. The Consul General felt that the Government could take a lead to improve connectivity and infrastructure development to bring about a big change in investment and growth. In Bangladesh, the Japanese Government is spending substantially for improving connectivity and increasing energy supply. With improved infrastructure facilitating movement of goods across borders in West Bengal and neighbouring States as well as neighbouring countries, it should be possible to attract not only large Japanese companies but also Japanese SMEs who were interested to come but would need help. Quite a few Japanese Companies have invested in Bangladesh, a country with a large population. The aspect of building connectivity infrastructure needs to be looked into for the development of the entire East.

The other aspect which the Consul General felt was important for attracting Japanese Companies was to project to them some success stories like the story of Maruti Suzuki in India. Demand for heavy machinery in India was strong and Hitachi Heavy Machinery was setting up units in Kharagpur, Jamshedpur and in Karnataka. A floating fish feed company was coming up in Kharagpur which would cater to the entire Eastern region and would increase production depending on the increase in demand. The Consul General stated that as far as future investments are concerned, India was still a preferred destination for Japanese Companies. Many companies had already invested in the South and the West as well as in Gujarat.

Mr. Taga's address was followed by an engaging Q/A session.

ROUNDTABLE ON 'BUSINESS DELIVERY MODELS FOR SOLAR ENERGY IMPLEMENTATION'

To commemorate 'Solar Appreciation Day', (EDN India), in association with (BCCI&i) organized a roundtable discussion on 'Business Delivery Models for Solar Energy Implementations' on Friday, 10th March 2017 at The American Center, Kolkata. The objective was to identify successful policies and programs, and also any impediments to a faster rate of growth of solar power in India.

India has set an ambitious goal of 175 GW (gigawatts) renewable energy production by 2022. Of that, 100 GW is to come from solar (with 40 of the 100 GW projected generation from rooftop solar). India also anchored the International Solar Allaince of 121 countries located between the Tropic of Cancer and the Tropic of Capricorn. The Finance Minister of India, in the Budget Speech of 1st February 2017, announced

a second phase of Solar Park development for an additional 20,000 MW (megawatts) capacity, the reduction of custom duty on solar panel components, and increased allocation for the infrastructure sector.

Despite all these positive policies in place and the benefit of 300 days of sunshine that India has on an average, solar energy installed capacity remains as low as 3.17% of total installed energy capacity. At the current pace, projected installed rooftop solar capacity in India will only be able to achieve 12 GW by 2022. The focus of the discussion was to bring together stakeholders in solar energy propagation and discuss appropriate and effective business delivery models for solar energy implementation.

On 5th April 2017, a Japanese Delegation comprising Mr. Takahiro Ochi, Chief Manager Business Strategies Division Tokyo office, Mobile Create Co., Ltd; Mr. Chikahide Itoh, Managing Director, Future Electronics Co., Ltd and Mr. Kazuchika Oka, Mobile Create Co. Ltd. along with Mr. Kanwaljeet Singh Goindi, Managing Director Nippon Audiotronix Pvt. Ltd and Mr. Shailesh Jain, AGM-Business Development of Nippon Audiotronix Pvt. Ltd met with the local delegation comprising Mr. Aninda Chatterjee, Executive Director (Finance), Webel; Mr. Rajiv K Poddar, Co-Founder & CEO, Smartpower Automation; Mr. Biswadeep Biswas, KPMG; Mr. Rohit Sarkar, Distronix; Mr. Ashok Mukherjee, Sonodyne; Mr. Prasenjit Misra, Switching AVO Electro Power Ltd.; Mr. Abhishek Roy, Principal Consultant, SEMT and Mr. Partha Sarathi Biswas, Signotron.

The discussion was on new improved transportation solutions and the scope of application of intelligent technology to the transportation system in Kolkata/West Bengal. The meeting commenced with a presentation delivered by the Japanese team from Mobile Create which works for transport and business solutions. They spoke about their business case studies in Japan's transportation system. As highlighted by the delegation, Mobile Create is a pioneer in launching IP-based PTT. Their other works include use of drones and other tools.

They discussed about OKICA transport system (OKICA or Okinawa IC Card is a ticket to travel on Okinawa's monorail (Yui Rail) and buses on cashless model). The technology also facilitates:

- tracking commuters (children and senior citizens) traveling alone through IC card (smart card) status
- paperless settlement of documents through central system
- locating a vehicle (here bus) this gives accurate bus

schedules to track buses for the commuters It also includes several safety features including use of advanced technology to count number of travelers on each transport at a given point of time.

Following the presentation, the local delegates introduced themselves and their organizations and their expertise in bringing technological advancements in their respective fields. The discussion included viability of the Japanese technology in West Bengal. The practical challenges in adapting this technology were discussed in depth. Some important points discussed were the cost involved in adapting such a technology along with its durability under circumstances of a natural disaster.

In conclusion, the Japanese Delegation was requested to propose a pilot project to which Mr. Goindi added that further meetings and exchange of data would help to firm it up.

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry organized a Special Interactive Session with His Excellency, Mr.
Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory, Hon'ble Vice President of Republic of Mauritius on 17th April 2017 at The Chamber premises. The session was graced by His Excellency Mr.
Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory, Hon'ble Vice President of Republic of Mauritius and Mr. Deven Coopoosamy, Partner - Client Relationship CORPORATE, Rogers Capital, Mauritius. The audience included important stakeholders and members of the Chamber. The objective of the session was to explore bilateral business opportunities between India and Mauritius in general and building new bonds between Kolkata/West

Bengal and Mauritius in particular.

It was the first ever business forum His Excellency graced in the City.

His Excellency Mr. Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory and Mr. Deven Coopoosamy took a walk down the Calcutta Gallery accompanied by Mr. Sutanu Ghosh, President, BCC&I, Mr. Subhodip Ghosh, Director General BCC&I and Ms. Angana Guha Roy Chowdhury, Deputy Director, BCC&I, following which the interactive session commenced.

Mr. Sutanu Ghosh, in his welcome speech, highlighted the Indo-Mauritius bilateral relations and also introduced the Hon'ble Vice President to the audience. Mr. Abhishek Basu, Executive Trustee of Basu Foundation for the Arts, the cultural partner of BCC&I for this event, showcased the gamut of interesting work that The Basu Foundation had been doing on connecting people through art, through an audio visual presentation,.

An Introduction of Business Opportunities along with the Ease of Doing Business in Mauritius was presented by Mr. Deven Cooposamy with the help of an audio visual presentation.

Subsequently, His Excellency Mr. Paramasivum Pillay Vyapoory addressed the gathering by elaborating on the ideal environment for doing business in the island nation and the bilateral relationship between India and Mauritius. The Hon'ble Vice President mentioned that Mauritius had a skilled workforce and modern infrastructure for setting up factories. He shared how Mauritius used to be a mono-crop model economy at the time of their Independence when sugar used to constitute 90% of their trade which accounted for only 1% of their GDP, and how the Government now envisions raising Mauritius to the level of a high income economy as part of the Vision 2030 exercise. His Excellency spoke of the trade links Mauritius has had with India, where he mentioned certain facts like - India has been the largest exporter of goods and services to Mauritius and how India and Mauritius have been sharing strong trade relations even in the recent past, and how the double tax avoidance convention has helped play a key role in enhancing the financial statistics.

Excellency Mr. Vyapoory named several places/monuments that were named after famous Indians including Mahatma Gandhi, Jawaharlal Nehru, Swami Vivekananda and Rabindranath Tagore. The relations between the armed forces of India and Mauritius have also been good. The famous Mauritius navy ship, Barracuda was constructed by an Indian shipbuilder, while even today India carries out patrols and surveillances with Mauritius.

India is Mauritius's leading trading partner and has been the largest exporter of goods and services to the country since 2007. His Excellency highlighted the joint operations that both the countries are carrying out presently, with a reference to the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India His Excellency Shri Narendra Modi's Mauritius visit in 2015. His Excellency complimented the Hon'ble Prime Minister for redefining the bilateral relationship between the two countries during his visit.

The proposed Indo-Mauritius Comprehensive Economic Cooperation and Partnership Agreement is expected to be signed later this year as both countries finalised the areas of exchange, he added. He said that the two sides had agreed upon the areas in which the agreement would be implemented. Areas which have been identified are financial services, ICT, health, education, R&D and construction. He said that the agreement would lead to an expansion of trade on both sides and enhanced investment besides enhanced economic relations. Sectors which offered investment opportunities to Indian companies were ICT and BPO, banking services and insurance. He also mentioned that investments in Mauritius will give Indian companies preferential market access to USA and to Africa.



To highlight the strong Indian influence on Mauritius, His

Regarding the Direct Tax Avoidance Convention (DTAC) between India and Mauritius, he said that it was due to this agreement that the cumulative equity inflow to India till April, 2015 was to the tune of USD87 bn. He said that India had extended several lines of credit to Mauritius, the last one being USD500 million announced by Prime Minister Narendra Modi in March, 2015. Mauritius is also ready to offer financial incentives to the Indian film industry, he observed. His Excellency thanked The Bengal Chamber for providing a relevant platform for exploring bilateral trade and B2B interfaces.


