MEETING WITH SHRI HARSH VARDHAN SHRINGLA, INDIAN AMBASSADOR TO THE KINGDOM OF THAILAND

Shri Harsh Vardhan Shringla is India's ambassador to Thailand. In his recent visit to Kolkata on October 29, 2014, Shri Shringla met with the senior office bearers of the Chambers of Commerce and industry representatives. From The Bengal Chamber of Commerce & Industry, President Dr. Alok Roy, Director General Mr. P Roy and Capt. S B Mazumdar, Chairman, Shipping Committee attended the meeting, at the Lalit Great Eastern Hotel, Kolkata. It was an interactive session with the Ambassador on India's bilateral economic relations with Thailand. Having established diplomatic relations for over 65 years, Thailand continues to be one of India's most prominent partners in the field of Commerce and Industry, besides being a popular tourist destination in the East. Thai-India bilateral trade has grown significantly and has multiplied six times since 2000 to reach 8.67 billion USD and it is expected to grow further in the years to come. India's 'Look East' policy has been complemented by Thailand's 'Look West' policy in bringing the two countries closer.

Mr. Marc Knapper is a member of the Senior Foreign Service and is currently serving as the Director of the Department of State's Office of India Affairs. Mr. Gaurav Bansal, Consul for Political & Economic Affairs accompanied Mr. Knapper from the US Consulate General. From the Bengal Chamber, President Dr. Alok Roy and Senior Vice President Mr. Sutanu Ghosh along with Mr. P Roy, Director General were present.

The focus of the discussions was the economic scenario in the Eastern Region and Bengal and our Chamber's role. Mr. Knapper was extremely positive about the Chamber's role in promoting Clean Technology development and spread and expressed interest in the U.S. Mission's continuing partnership with the Chamber. He was upbeat about the potential for bilateral cooperation. Dr. Alok Roy, the President of The Bengal Chamber, urged Mr. Knapper to help fortify the ties with other regional Chambers from the neighboring countries like Bangladesh, Nepal, Thailand, Myanmar and others. Dr. Roy stressed that the Chamber acts as an interface for the industry and it is therefore important to develop a regional council. There were also discussions on GST and the economy of West Bengal. It was explained to Mr. Knapper that the Chief Minister is extremely buoyant and eager to make relevant changes in the system, and the Chamber is positive about industrial investment in the State.

On the occasion of the Bi-centenary year for the Indian Museum, Dr. B Venugopal, Director, spoke specially about the Buddha relics in the Indian Museum. His speech focused on the collections covering the various facets of Buddhism, e.g.,

- Bharhut railing.
- Ø Gandhara sculptures (including the first excavated material from the Gandhara region)
- Ø Mathura school
- Ø Sarnath school
- **Buddhist relics**

He mentioned that, according to Buddhist tradition, the relics of the Buddha are of three kinds:

- Physical (Saririka): Hair, bone, teeth
- Utilitarian (Paribhogika): Objects used by the Buddha: Bo-tree, robes, alms bowl
- Commemorations (Uddesika): Shrine, images

The Indian Museum, Kolkata acquired the first Buddha relics found from Piprahwa, Basti District, Uttar Pradesh from the then North Western Province Government (date of acquisition 20.09.1898). These were found along with several pearls, coral pieces, gold and silver leaves, a small umbrella and a small female figure inside four relic caskets (in steatite and one in crystal). All of these were kept inside a large stone coffer.

The Chairman of the Tourism Committee Mr. Manab Pal was of the opinion that Kolkata has sufficient tourism infrastructure. The Central Government has allotted INR 500 crores for promoting Buddhist Tourism in India part of which should be utilized for displaying the relics of Lord Buddha, namely, "Nirvana Asthi", which is proposed to be exclusively displayed in a separate air-conditioned gallery in the Indian Museum.

Mr. Pal informed that 1.2 million Buddhists tourists visit Bihar every year on Buddhist Pilgrimage and 3 million Buddhist tourists visit Candy in Sri Lanka every year to worship Lord Buddha's relic in Candy Temple. Therefore, the tourism industry should target a minimum 2,50,000 Buddhist pilgrims to visit Kolkata to pay their obeisance to 'Nirvana Asthi' at Indian Museum in the very first year after inauguration of the relic targeted on 15th August,

2015. Presently around 50,000 Buddhist tourists transit through Kolkata but do not spend any time at "Destination Kolkata". Mr. Pal further mentioned that the IRCTC has introduced a special train, Mahaparinirvan Express from New Delhi catering solely to Buddhist tourists. It is an entire travel package that IRCTC is offering for a complete tour of the "Buddhist Circuit". Mr. Jagannathan reiterated that the same train could be run through the Kolkata circuit starting from Kolkata and ending in Kolkata and IRCTC is prepared to offer complete rake with food and beverage facilities so that the tourists can use the train as a hotel. The rake consists of first class chair cars as well as two and three tier AC compartments. Railway authorities are prepared to provide special menu if required. However, the whole rake must be booked for a minimum 200 passengers with minimum two months' notice.

SCREENING OF "AFTER MY GARDEN GROWS" - CSR DIALOGUE ON GIRL CHILD EMPOWERMENT

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry, in collaboration with USAID and ICCO organized the screening of Oscar winning director Megan Mylan's latest release, "After My Garden Grows" on Wednesday 19th November 2014 from 2.30 p.m. to 4.00 p.m. at the Lincoln Room, American Center, Kolkata. The documentary is on the real life story of a rural girl from Coochbehar, West Bengal. It is a short documentary that captures a rising tide in rural West Bengal where more than 40,000 adolescent girls have become breadwinners and revolutionized the Indian daughter stereotype. The film explored the strategy for empowering young girls, underway in rural India. It revealed one powerful solution among hundreds that are changing the girls' futures in measurable replicable ways. The documentary touches deeply-ingrained traditions like dowry and archaic customs in rural Bengal and takes notice of how the present generation is coming out of the cocoon.

The programme was addressed by Smt. Roshni Sen, IAS, Principal Secretary, Department of Women & Child Development and Social Welfare, Government of West Bengal; Ms. Joanne Joria, Director American Center, US Consulate General – Kolkata; Ms. Helen Lafave, Consul General of the United States in Kolkata and Mr. P Roy, Director General, The Bengal Chamber. 

SENSITIZATION ON THE ISSUES AND IMPLICATIONS OF WORKPLACE SEXUAL HARASSMENT

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry in association with Full Circle organized a workshop on "Sensitization on the issues and implications of workplace Sexual Harassment" on 19th November 2014 at ITC room of the Bengal Chamber. The objective was to interact with CEOs,HR Heads and Internal Complaint Committee members of different companies to make them aware of the Act and Policies of The Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013. Ms. Sunita Thawani (Founder CEO of Full Circle) was a guest speaker. Some of the participants included Mr. Gulu Balani (VP-HR & Corporate Services of Embee Software Pvt. Ltd.), Ms. Sreela Das Gupta (Head Diversity and Inclusion at BPS of Tata Consultancy Services), Ms. Swati Sharma (Dy. Manager, HR of Birla Corporation Ltd.), Smt. Y Lama (CM & Chairperson ICC of National Insurance Company Ltd.), Mr. Rajib Roy (AVP Administration of EREVMAX), Mr. Narendranath Chattopadhyay (Managing Director of Sicorp India), and many more.

This hands-on session included question and answers segment addressing the following points:-

- Difference between Harassment in general and Sexual Harassment.
- Knowing stereotypes associated with men & women and how they affect the conscious and subconscious behaviour at workplaces.
- Different forms of sexual harassment as per the Act.
- Awareness of other important legal definitions of the new law.
- Rights of Complainant and Accused.
- Checklists of Do's and Don'ts for men, women, observers and employees.

- Awareness on false or malicious charges.
- Employers' mandatory obligations under the Act and penalties for non-compliance. Effects of Sexual Harassment on the individuals, institutions and society.

The participants were greatly benefited as they came to know each other's expectations & anxieties, they understood perceptions and causes of misunderstandings, they became aware of benefits of inculcating respect for self and respect for others, they came to know about the compliances and consequences for non compliance. The participants expressed their willingness to participate in this type of workshop in the future.

ROUNDTABLE ON BIOENERGY ISSUES AND OPTIONS WITH THE WORLD BIOENERGY ASSOCIATION AND IISWBM

The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry (BCC&I) and Indian Institute of Social Welfare and Business Management (IISWBM), in association with the World Bioenergy Association organized a Roundtable on Bioenergy on 26th November 2014 at the Williamson Magor Hall, BCC&I premises. An international delegation from the World Bioenergy Association participated in the programme. Around 100 local delegates from industry, research institutions and NGOs attended the programme.

Dr. Anindya Narayan Biswas, WBCS (Executive), Jt. Secretary (Power & NCES), Department of Power & NCES, Government of West Bengal was the Chief Guest. Prof (Dr.) Amitava Sarkar, Director, IISWBM; Prof (Dr.) S C Bhattacharya, Vice President, WBA and Adjunct Professor, IISWBM; Prof (Dr.) B K Choudhury, Professor, Department of Energy Management, IISWBM; Dr. Heinz Kopetz, President World Bioenergy Association (WBA); Prof. Sujay Basu, Former Director, School of Energy Studies, Jadavpur University and Key Lead, Energy and Environment Committee, The Bengal Chamber; and Mr. Suman Lahiri, Regional Director, EBTC addressed the

programme among other speakers.

Nearly 25% of India's primary energy comes from biomass. Biomass fuels in the form of fuel wood, dung and crop residues play a key role in meeting energy demands in India, particularly in rural areas. About 70% of India's population depend on biomass to meet their cooking energy needs. India has a huge potential of bioenergy. Although MNRE's recent annual reports suggest that the potential of agro-residues and plantations in the country total about 16,888 MW, in the report of 2005-2006 the estimated potential of power based on plantation on 21 Mha of waste lands was indicated to be 52,000 MW. The Committee on India Vision 2020 as well as the Standing Committee on Energy of the Indian Parliament estimated the total power potential of biomass from plantations in wasteland alone to be 100,000 MW. Thus, the total potential of biomass including wood from plantations, crop residues, wastes etc. should be substantially higher than 100,000 MW.

A number of policies, including Feed-in Tariff, Renewable Purchase Obligation, and financial incentives (capital subsidy, interest subsidy, etc.), have been developed to promote renewable energy, including bioenergy. Although these served to trigger bioenergy development to some extent, the sector still faces several problems. Only about 4,480 MW of biopower capacity including cogeneration has been realized to date. Due to rising cost of and uncertainty in assured fuel supply, several biopower plants are reported to have been closed down in India. Although highly efficient and clean modern biomass gasifier stoves are locally produced in the country, level of acceptance of these remains very low so far. India has a 5% ethanol blending mandate at present. Although National Biofuel Policy established in 2009 set an ambitious target of 20% blending for both ethanol and biodiesel by 2017, interest in India in biofuels - jatropha plantation in particular - appears to have died down to a large extent because of a number of factors. India's energy import bill has been growing in recent years; it is estimated that the oil import bill alone amounted to 6.93 lakh crores (or trillion) rupees in 2011-12. For reducing dependence on imported fossil fuels as well as import bill, and enhancing national energy security, there is an urgent need to accelerate the pace of development of bioenergy and other renewable energy resources.

This event brought together different stakeholder groups of bioenergy to highlight problems and barriers faced by the sector as well as policy measures needed to remove these and stimulate bioenergy development. The participants were highly appreciative of the effort. Following the programme, a set of recommendations were prepared and sent to the relevant Government departments and also researchers.




