Product line "Single yarn comb fibre (5205230000)" with an export value of US \$23.4 million represents 92% market share of total Peruvian imports of this item. Product "Single yarn comb fibre (5205220000)" with an export value of US \$19 million represents 91.6% market share. Peruvian imports from India of "Medicines for human use (3004902900)" and "Vaccines for human medicine (3002209000)" were among India's top 10 export items. Both products showing a growth of about 36% and 142% respectively during Jan-Jul 2019 over the same period in 2018. During the period of report, India's exports to Peru declined by about 4% from \$516 million in Jan-Jul 2018 to \$493 million in Jan-Jul 2019. The main exports items of Peru to India are Gold in other unwrought forms (7108120000) and Copper ores and concentrates (2603000000) which together account for about 98% of total Peruvian shipments to India. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The month of July saw first-time entry of an Indian product in the Peruvian market, namely, "other tubes iron or steel" (HTS # 7305310000). India exported \$6 million worth of this product to Peru and it comprised 70% market share out of Peru's total imports of \$8.6 million of this item. Steps have been being taken to address the decline in exports.
